

Welcome to Nursery Spring Term 2 Newsletter 2025

Can you believe we are halfway through the school year?

We are looking forward to working together to support your child's learning journey. This half term our topics are Dinosaurs, People who help us, Growing and Transport. Here is some information about the skills and knowledge your child will be learning linked to these topics.

The children have loved our Little Wandle Phonics Scheme called Foundations for Phonics. We have taught the children 12 new sounds/phonemes s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,c/k,e, it would be great if you could recap these with your child at home. During our Numbers and patterns sessions we have taught the children to recite numbers past 5, to recognise numerals, talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes, to use mathematical language, to extend and create patterns.




JoJo loves playing with Dinosaurs, her grandma takes her to a museum to find a real Dinosaur. They cannot find the way so follow footsteps to eventually find the Dinosaur skeleton. I love this story as it invites conversations about trips to museums, how the children travelled there, what they saw and discussions about Dinosaurs. In this book the children learn new vocabulary - bones, skeleton, fossils, millions. The illustrations are wonderful!









Book Review this half term - Mrs Benham-Smith recommends — The Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister



This is an oldie but goodie, an award-winning book about the beautiful fish who learned to share his most prized possession. Shining from Rainbow Fish's multi-coloured body are several shimmering silver scales. All the other fish in the ocean admire him and want to play, but Rainbow Fish is too proud to play with them; nor will he share his sparkling scales. Alone and friendless, Rainbow Fish soon learns that generosity is far more rewarding than vanity. A book that fits so well with many of our school values.
