



Curriculum Overview for Spring 1								
English	All our writing this half term will be linked to our topic, Anicent Egypt. The children will begin by using their learning from enrichment day to write instructions on how to mummify an orange. Following on from this, the children will then read the first two pages of 'The Time-Slip Scarab' and will have to predict how the story continues. During their narrative writing, the children will adapt parts of the original story to make it their own narrative about exploring Egypt. They will finish by writing a newspaper report about Howard Carter's discovery.

History	We will be learning where Ancient Egypt fits in within our historic timeline, daily life in Egypt, the pyramids and afterlife.							
Art	The children will be creating their own Egyptian wall hangings. We will begin the process by doing some still sketching followed by a watercolour wash and finally painting the details.							
PSHE	This half term, the Jigsaw unit is 'Dreams and Goals'. In this unit, children will be thinking about their dream jobs, investigating jobs and careers, followed by understanding the steps they need to take to achieve their dream job.

The children will be trained by professional, fully qualified instructors and accompanied by an adult from the school for each of the sessions. Please note, this is a first come, first serve basis, with 72 spaces available.


An instructor from the Bikeability team will be coming into school to talk to the children and offer a Q&A session on Thursday 6th February.

Book Recommendations

Miss Cook recommends..

The Haunting of Fortune Farm by Sophie Kirtley

This is a very exciting book that definitely kept me on my toes! I absolutely loved this spooky mystery and finding out what happened to the long-lost Viking hoard.



Fionn Boyle and his sister Tara have been sent to stay with their grandfather on the remote island of Arranmore (a real-life island just off the coast of north-west Ireland) for the summer. Whilst on the island, Fionn's relationship with his grandfather develops and he is drawn into an adventure involving mythical spirits. This fantasy novel draws upon Irish myths and legends to conjure up magical, dream-like

qualities that will allow you fall in love with the writing. I love this book because the author does a great job of writing believable characters (the sibling relationship between Fionn and Tara is full of bickering, which might be relatable!) and vivid descriptions of the island of Arranmore.

Miss Huish recommends.. Shadow Creatures by Chris Vick

In Balen Class, we read an extract from Shadow Creatures and were hooked! It is a fantastic book, that is set in Norway during Word War II. It explored the courage of those living through WW2 and has key links to the author's own family history.

BookTrust, Great Book Guide 2023 describes Shadow Creatures as 'Action-packed, moving and thought-provoking, this book will take your breath away."







Mrs Dobson reccomends.. Hero.com and Villain.net by Andy Briggs

Written by the same author, Andy Briggs has cleverly intertwined stories in different books to gain different perspectives. Imagine that you happen to come across a webpage that offers you a superpower. Which one would you select? How would it help you in your life? What you use it for

good or bad? In Hero.com and villain.net you go on adventures where children do exactly that - discover that what they think is a game, actually becomes reality. If you like action-packed adventure, these books are for you. And the great news, there's a whole series of them to read through.

Reading at home:

Please try to ensure that your child is reading at least 3 times per week at home, this has such a big impact on their learning. Please record this in the red homeschool link books. Children can record their reading themselves, as long as this is acknowledged and signed by an adult. Homeschool link books are collected by class teachers and checked every Monday.
